The destination is the Riviera de Maya, South of Cancun. With excellent reef and cenote (cave/underground river diving) diving as well as site seeing to Mayan ruins and nearby natural snorkeling parks Xcaret and Xe-Ha, this is a super getaway for the whole family. The resort is all-inclusive and a terrific value.

The Spiegel Grove served the US Navy as a 510 foot long landing craft tender, it assisted in the recovery of Apollo 14. In 2002, after nearly a decade of planning and fund raising the ship was sunk off Key Largo. Unfortunately the sinking did not go as planned and the ship capsized and protruded from the water creating a hazard to navigation. With the help of tech divers and lift bag technology the ship

was turned enough to sink to the bottom on its side in 130 feet of water. It has been an exciting dive form the start. Then in

tain our factory authorized service center status with Scubapro, Genesis and Sherwood and have added Atomic Aquatics and Ocean Reef.




Let's Talk Training

We still offer NAUI standard training courses, but we are developing some other specialty course areas such as spear fishing and photography.


