
## Exciting News Destination Truth

Now and again, television and film producers will call the office, asking about the Ocean REEF line and the benefits of using the masks in a film setting.

But what if you're looking for extra comfort in cold water or a simpler hose setup for a cave dive? Ocean REEF's line of accessories has something for you and every diver.

In cold water environments, the Polar Mesh strap provides improved comfort. Unlike rubber, the fabric straps will not become rigid and brittle as the water temperature drops. The soft mesh backing also offers a gentler fit for people with long hair.

For wreck divers concerned about getting a hose caught on debris, our swivel connection makes hose organization simple. The swivel connection rotates 45 degrees inward and 360 degrees around. This allows divers to place their hose closer to their torso rather than having it swing out into a loop. The increased mobility can also prevent hoses from tangling.

If you're tired of pulling out the wrench each time you need to detach your mask, the quick connect hose makes this a snap. After installing the male end of this accessory into the second stage, disconnecting your mask is as simple as pulling on the hose release.

For professional divers, Ocean REEF also offers a commercial quick connect that requires two hands to disconnect.

The optical lens support allows for the use of lenses while diving. The frame is light weight and can easily be inserted into a Neptune mask.

Technical Information:

### Maximizing your underwater communication

While there's no trick to talking underwater with an Ocean REEF communications unit, the elements sometimes don't make it easy. Here are a few tips to help you be 'loud and clear' in the depths:

#### Speak slowly and clearly

Talking underwater isn't the same as chatting on your cell phone. As you speak, emphasize each syllable to ensure your buddy understands what you're saying...like there's a shark behind you..

Keep exhaust away from your communications unit
Any and all bubbles can interfere with ultrasonic waves.
Make sure the exhaust is pointed away from your communications unit.

## Keep bubbles off your antenna

Sometimes bubbles like to attach to antennas, distorting the sound. Adding a thin layer of silicone grease to the antenna will prevent this.

## Tread gently across the ocean floor!

When swimming on the bottom, be careful to not kick up the ground. Like bubbles, displaced sediments can easily interfere with sound waves.

## Dive Sites The Red Sea

When thinking of Egypt, classic wonders come to mind, the Great Pyramids of Giza, the Sphinx, the Pharos monuments of Luxor, but do you think of the amazing diving within the Red Sea?

You'll find that camel diving in Egypt is equally impressive! The Red Sea, where the desert meets the ocean, is truly one of the planet's most exotic and fascinating natural seascape environments.

The diving in Sharm-el-Sheikh, probably the most sought after dive site in all of Egypt, holds absolutely astounding corals and sea life. The colorful corals come to within 1 meter from the surface and then continue down into the depths. The fish life is all over the reefs, allowing visitors the opportunity to view them easily from the surface. Sea life includes turtles, Blue Spotted rays, Lionfish, Butterfly fish, Parrotfish, Orange-striped Triggerfish and Surgeonfish. Visibility is as good as it gets with an average of 100-200 feet.

Water temperature is con-

sistently warm, usually warm enough to dive under a 3mil. The low humidity and the high rate of evaporation due to high temperatures, make the Red Sea one of the saltiest life-sustaining seas in the world. Salinity reaches 4.1 % and therefore a large variety of exclusively native species have developed. This also leads to one of the richest concentrations of varieties of marine life in all of the tropical seas.

Although it is said that Sharm has some of the best shore diving in the world, boat diving will take you to the real wonders. Egypt's seas are covered with not only reefs but walls and wrecks and Egyptian archaeological sites as well.

Thanks to the relatively sheltered position of Red Sea dive sites, they are protected from strong currents and waves and the fringing reefs extend all the way along the coast-line creating the perfect ecosystem for coral growth and fish life. On land or sea, Egypt truly is a wonderful place.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

As divers, we are privileged to explore the last frontier on the planet, our Oceans! However, with this privilege comes great responsibility. Preserving and protecting the sea is everyone's responsibility, but we as divers can often make the greatest impact.

There are endless ways you can contribute to marine conservation. For example:

- When planning a dive trip, look for "green" operators and resorts. These environmentally conscious businesses will often donate a portion of their fees to support conservation efforts.
- Take only photographs, leave only bubbles. Millions of creatures and rocks are taken home by divers, disrupting natural cycles.

- Reduce, reuse, recycle, the fewer disposable containers we use, the fewer we'll see in the oceans and shorelines. Boat responsibly.
- *Join a cleanup*. Check out www.coastalcleanup.org.
- Don't use Styrofoam.
- Watch that anchor.
- Shop for sustainable seafood.
- Buy a specialty license plate supporting oceans.
